Microcredit Programs OMEGA Healthcare: This partnership helped provide interest-free loans to 136 entrepreneurs, promoting entrepreneurship.




Partnerships with Omega Healthcare: New collaborations further boosted healthcare skilling programs, offering specialized training to individuals pursuing careers in healthcare.


Expansion of Seaweed Farming: Seaweed farming initiatives were expanded in the ECR region, providing sustainable livelihoods to over 100 families.

Now, all mothers can introduce themselves without any hesitation.




Economic Impact: The program has helped students earn 2-3 times more than their parents, improving families' socio-economic status.




